Time Line

- Friday 8:00am – Flights in leave Cave Junction Airport via Helicopter
Introduction, Settle in, Work time.
1:00pm – Lunch
Work time.
7:00pm – Dinner
Sat/Sunday/Mon 8:00am – Breakfast
Repeat schedule for lunch and dinner.
Tuesday 8:00am – Breakfast and photos.
9:00am – Flight out begins.

Items to bring in bag

- Clothes for 4 days, preferable 2-3 changes of outer cloths
- Medium weight rain jacket and sun hat
- Gloves (for working in water)
- Towel and wash cloth
- Medications, sun block, hand lotion, etc.
- Poison Oak soap. Tecnu works!
- Toiletries & pillow case.
- Your own snacks or candies
- Flash light.
- Camera!! (have it handy for the helicopter flight)
- Vacuum packed or duffle bagged sleeping Bag (3 lb). It must fit in your lap.
- Disposable rain gear.
- We recommend you bring extra medication for a week in the event weather delays departure date.

Note: we have extra wool blankets and small space heaters in the cabins.

Provided on site:

- Professional guides to assist with operations
- Equipment including dredges, hand sluice boxes and powered high-bankers with Oil/fuel
- Hand tools, sniffer bottles, Vials for gold, Buckets & rubber boots
- Cloths line to hang towels and wet cloths to dry
- All food
- Cabins
 - All beds are real mattresses and covers with pillows.
 - All cabins have 12 volt interior solar powered flourescent lighting.
 - Quick Shades 12x12 or 10x10
- Hand soap, bleach/lime/disinfectant
- Outhouse
- First aid and emergency satellite communication
- Emergency Satellite phone

Do not bring;

Pets, fireworks, equipment, loaded firearms (no rifles), large bulky items.

OTHER RULES AND PRECAUTIONS:

1. When leaving the camp, exploring in groups of two or more are required.
2. Rattle snakes, poison oak, loose and slippery rocks, unstable grounds, and sun burn are known hazards.
3. The area was burned in 2002 and the trees are dying. Be aware of high wind and dropping branches and trees. Also, the burned brush left sharp partially burned stems that are EXTREMELY SHARP and will penetrate a boot and foot. Be careful where you step!!!
4. Please don't litter. Including cigarette butts.
5. Discharge firearms only in the event of emergency. No hunting.
6. No smoking in the cabins.
7. Access to the site is by helicopter. It is the only feasible way in. Therefore, any delays in the schedule must be prepared for by the guests. In the event of bad weather and flight schedule flying in is delayed, it is the responsibility of the guest to cover their own meals and lodging. We do our best to keep the schedule of the trip as planned, however if you have a critical requirement to arrive back on time please check with the weather forecast before flying into the camp. Please recognize that a flexible schedule is needed.
8. Safety is first priority. Please practice it.
9. There is a buddy system. Two people will work per dredge/high-banker.
10. Minimum age is 18.
11. No illegal drugs.
12. Any special dietary or medical conditions must be disclosed prior to registration. The camp is remote and a special helicopter flight to get emergency help is your responsibility.
13. To send a Text message to the camp satellite phone:
 - a. Go to website www.iridium.com
 - b. Click on "Send a Satellite Message".
 - c. The "To:" address should have this number typed in it:
8816449264
 - d. Add text in the block provided as your message to the camp. Do not put a reply email address.
 - e. Add a phone number that can reach a person in the evening.
 - f. Click "Send".

We check Text Messages frequently but only when the phone is turned on. While at the property it is not powered on until we are ready to receive or send messages. Emergency messages will be returned in the evenings if warranted. Sending and receiving messages are FREE, however returning an emergency Text message is \$1.50/min.
